Safety Alert-Retail Theft

An alert from MPD neighborhood officer Jeff Pharo: A retail theft pattern of teenage females, working in groups of two or more, who work by distracting employees with questions and/or creating a commotion and then shoplift. Yesterday, police arrested a group that had been to area malls and then came downtown. Today, they arrested a group who actually battered a store employee.

Tips from MPD:

*Please DON'T give out empty shopping bags, especially if you suspect suspicious behavior. The MO of one of the groups – they each got an empty shopping bag from one store, then went to another store and filled the bags (but not with purchases).

*Be aware – If you sense suspicious behavior, be very proactive with customer service. Make sure the customers know you have your store covered and are aware of what they are doing.

*Do NOT hesitate to call police if you suspect suspicious behavior.

You can call 911 or (608) 266-4275 - Press 6 for "happening now"

Don't wait! Call ASAP, while incident is occurring.

What to Report: Exact location with address. Describe people involved: Clothing, height, and race, anything unique. What they are doing (specifics).

Mall Maintenance Sidewalk Washing Program Update

City Mall Maintenance has begun their new intensive sidewalk washing program. Next week, they expect to finish the south side of the 400 block of State Street and then move to the north side of the 300 block of State St. (They were going to start the 300 block of State St. this week, but they had to move to the 400 block so they could use the water connections in Peace Park because the cold winter and late spring delayed the turning-on of the water on State St.)

They will clean a specific area 2-3 days, from 6:30am to no later than 11:30am. If you have a sidewalk café, when they are cleaning in front of your business you will not be able to set up until after they are done (no later than 11:30 am).

ALDO Update

On Tues. 4/8 Council approved ordinance amendments that will refine Alcohol License Definitions (citywide) using the zoning code and will establish an Alcohol Overlay District in the lower State Street/600 block University areas, effective July 1, 2014. These replace the ALDO (Alcohol License Density Ordinance) July 1. I will circulate a link once the final version approved at Council is published.

The BID Board has worked on this issue since 2006, and carefully considered the new proposals in public meetings over the last year including three public informational meetings for BID stakeholders. The BID Board supported the overall new direction (even though it is more complicated) as more refined and flexible: more focused on specific licensing issues that affect safety and welfare; more predictable from both a community and business standpoint; and more dynamic to allow for innovative emerging businesses. Between now and July 1, BID will work with city staff so there is clear information for businesses on license definitions, licensing process, grandfathering of current businesses, and sale of businesses.

Next Tuesday, April 15, is the deadline to file for liquor or beer license renewal application [annual renewal of current licenses].

The deadline to file your liquor license renewal paperwork is April 15 every year, regardless of when the license was first issued.

Renewal applications filed after Tuesday, April 15, will be subject to a \$250 late filing fee. Invoices will be mailed the third week in May. Payment for liquor and beer licenses will be due on

Monday, June 9.

The City is reconstructing E. Main St. & King St. between Pinckney St. (Square) and Webster St. (Outer Loop) April 4 to mid-June (roughly 10-week project).

100 E. Main and King St. are completely closed to through traffic (access to Tenney Garage will be maintained, mostly from Webster, with E. Main a 2-way cul de sac), and 100 S. Pinckney will become a 2-way cul de sac accessible from E. Doty. No access to King or S. Pinckney from the Square.
